# Semester Two Mock Reading Exam

### **Assessment Description**

The Mock Reading Exam contains **30 multiple choice questions**.

These questions are based on the three texts <u>here</u>, which were made available on Moodle from the 4th March (10 questions for each text).

Each question has 4 possible responses. You should attempt to answer as many questions as possible within the time allowed.

**IMPORTANT**: Although this exam is based on three texts with ten questions for each text, the final reading assessment will be based on **two texts** with **fifteen questions** for each text.

Everything else (including times and question types) will be the same.

# **Moodle Quiz Information**

- Answers to questions can be found in the sections of text above the questions.
- Once you have submitted an answer, you cannot change it or see it again: you CANNOT go back to a question once you submit it.
- There is no time limit to answer individual questions, but remember that you have 75 minutes to answer 30 questions (15 questions for each text).
- The exams will be recorded on Zoom and we will investigate any suspicion of cheating.
- It is recommended that you find a quiet room in which to take the exam.
- Please make sure your electronic devices are plugged in or fully charged. Turn off notifications from messaging apps during the exam.

# Semester Two Mock Reading Exam

## **Moodle Quiz Rules**

- Once you have started the quiz you must NOT type on a keyboard, use a phone, or any other device. You must NOT use a pen and paper to take notes. The only allowed actions are scrolling and clicking.
- You must NOT use any web pages other than Moodle.
- You must NOT use a copy of the full assessment reading text.
- You must have your camera on at ALL times and you must NOT be muted. Turn off the volume so that you are not distracted by other students.
- Your entire face must be visible at ALL times.
- You must NOT use any kind of virtual background.
- You must NOT eat during the exam. You may drink water.
- You must NOT look away from your computer screen repeatedly or for an extended period of time. You could be suspected of cheating.
- You CANNOT leave the exam early. If you finish early, make sure you submit the quiz, but do NOT leave the LockDown Browser or use your phone. Wait patiently and look at the screen.
- You CANNOT use the toilet or leave your seat during the exam unless it is an emergency. In this case, a report will be made and you will be contacted to explain the issue after the exam.

If you break any of these rules, you may be disqualified from the exam. If you are suspected of cheating, you are at risk of being expelled from NU.

## **Before the Exam**:

Download the LockDown Browser if you have not done so already:

- Select the quiz named 'LockDown Browser Download' on Moodle.
- You will see the message "This quiz has been configured so that students may only attempt it using the Respondus LockDown Browser."
- Below this will appear a "Download LockDown Browser" link. Click the button to go to the download page and then follow the instructions.
- Download Respondus LockDown Browser to your computer; follow the installation instructions.

Note: LockDown Browser only needs to be installed once to a computer or device. If you still have it downloaded from last semester, you do not need to download it again. The browser will start automatically when a quiz requires it.

# Semester Two Mock Reading Exam Instructions

### **On Exam Day:**

1.Make sure your computer and phone are fully charged before the exam begins. You will use your phone to join the Zoom meeting. You will use your computer to take the exam on Moodle.

Once you join the lockdown browser, you will not be able to see the time on your computer. If your phone is placed vertically, you can see the time on your screen while using Zoom.

2. Open Zoom and join your class's Zoom meeting with your phone at 10.00am on the day of the exam.

Make sure your camera shows your full face as it would during a normal Zoom lesson.

- a. Make sure your phone is fully charged before the exam begins.
- b. If your Zoom call is ended at any time during the exam, rejoin the Zoom call immediately.

3. First, your tutor will give instructions. When your tutor tells you to, turn on your mic, but then turn off/down the volume on your computer.

This means that the tutor will still be able to hear you, but you will not be distracted by the other students' mics on Zoom.

4. Go to the EAP Assessments Page 2020-21 on Moodle and wait for the exam to begin at 10.15am. At 10.15am, enter the quiz for your group number and click 'Launch LockDown Browser.'

a. The browser may ask you to quit Skype, Discord, or other applications.

b.Click 'Close Process' to quit those applications.

5. The LockDown Browser should direct you to Moodle. Log into Moodle and go to the quiz. There should be a button that allows you to begin the exam.

6. Take the reading exam. Do NOT forget to click submit at the end of the exam. a. If you finish the exam early, do NOT leave the LockDown Browser! b. You must stay for the entire 75 minutes.

7. Once the 75 minutes has ended, click the quit button at the bottom right of the LockDown Browser.

You may leave the Zoom meeting when your teacher tells you to do so.
